A Public Hearing by the Board of Education of Millburn C.C. School District 24, Lake County, Illinois, held at Millburn West School, was called to order at 7:01 p.m. by President Kenneth Dewitt.

Mr. Dewitt stated that the purpose of the hearing was to allow public comment regarding the district's proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2009.

There was no public comment on the budget. Mr. Dewitt asked Dr. Cheryl Kucera to discuss the district's annual State Report Card, while the Public Hearing remained open. It was explained that the ISAT tests taken in the spring, which are the basis for the Report Card, were re-scored throughout the state because of concerns expressed by several districts. Dr. Kucera said her major concerns were with the 8th grade reading results. In that area, the re-scoring lowered the number of Millburn students exceeding standards by 50 percent. Districts across the state have since reported issues with the re-scoring. The state has asked districts to report anomalies that they find in the scores. Dr. Kucera said the validity of the scores statewide has been questioned, but she doubts the state will make any further changes. The district must release the scores in the State Report Card by Oct. 31.

At 7:16 p.m., Kenneth Dewitt asked again for any public comment on the proposed Budget. There was none, and the Public Hearing was adjourned.

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The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of Millburn C.C. School District 24, Lake County, Illinois, held at Millburn West School, was called to order at 7:17 p.m. by President Kenneth Dewitt. Roll call was dispensed with because it had been taken prior to the start of the meeting with the following Board Members in attendance: Robert Buehler, Kenneth Dewitt, Stacy Freeman, Thomas Heinrich, Shawn Lahr, Therese Schmidt and Chris Stream.

<u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u> -- A motion was made by Shawn Lahr and seconded by Stacy Freeman to approve the Minutes of the Regular Board Meeting of Aug. 18, 2008. On a voice vote, all Board Members voted Aye. Nays: none. Absent: none. The motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT -- Gary White reported that during August about \$470,000 was transferred out of Certificates of Deposit, which left a balance of about \$3.9 million invested at the end of the month. Since then, more than \$3 million in property tax revenue has been received, and another \$1 million is expected this week. It is still anticipated that the district will need to borrow about \$3.7 million during this fiscal year. A motion was made by Stacy Freeman and seconded by Shawn Lahr to approve the Treasurer's Report. Mrs. Dodd said she trying to separate facts from rumors. Kenneth Dewitt said that personnel issues cannot be discussed in open session. However, the minutes of board meetings, posted on the district website are an accurate reflection of what happened concerning this situation. He explained that although Mrs. Dewitt's resignation was tabled, she is no longer employed by the school district.

BUDGET FOR FY09 -- Dr. James Menzer explained that the proposed Budget for Fiscal year 2009 totals \$24 million. The main highlight is that includes \$3.7 million in Tax Anticipation Warrants that will be needed to meet anticipated expenses. ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

<u>SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT</u> -- Dr. James Menzer reminded the Board that the Millburn Fall Festival is set for Sept. 20 at Central. He said he has invited Warren High School to send a representative to be available to answer questions regarding that district's upcoming referendum. Dr. Menzer noted that during Millburn's curriculum nights about nine people registered to vote.

<u>CURRICULUM DIRECTOR'S REPORT</u> -- Dr. Cheryl Kucera reported that today was the first day of MAP testing, and it will continue for the next two weeks. The results will be one of the topics at an upcoming Teacher's Institute Day. Teachers also have attended training sessions on the new Grades 1-5 reading program and on one of the pilot reading programs.

<u>TECHNOLOGY DIRECTOR'S REPORT</u> -- Joanne Rathunde said she is investigating new communications programs for items such as calendars and e-mail. Also, the district was approved for e-rate funding for this year, which covers about 40 percent of communication bills.

<u>SPECIAL SERVICES DIRECTOR'S REPORT</u> -- Elizabeth Keefe reported that the AIMS-web benchmark testing is complete and all scores have been entered. This data will be used to identify students that are struggling and in need of intervention. She is continuing to work on the RTI plan, which is due to the state on Jan. 1, 2009.

<u>PRINCIPALS' REPORT</u> -- Jake Jorgenson said he took an informal survey at the last Millburn West PTO meeting concerning curriculum nights. He said parents gave positive feedback and approved of the format. The fall sports season is underway, including volleyball, soccer and cross-country.

Jason Lind reported that Central's athletes are now competing in a new athletic conference, and the students have met with early success. The Bully Prevention program will be introduced at an upcoming assembly. There has already been a lot of discussion regarding this topic with students, staff and parents. Also, fifth grade students now have an opportunity to be recess supervisors for the first graders. Many fifth graders have volunteered and signed pledges to fulfill the responsibilities of a recess supervisor.
