# Support for Mandated Programs

- Combined expenditures for mandated special education programs for the six sample districts exceed \$29,895,000 while State reimbursements amount to \$9,227,000
- Our school districts are required to fund the resulting gap of approximately \$20,668,000
- Mandates in special education class sizes have accelerated the local district financial burden. Financial relief must be provided in order to continue to provide services at a level appropriate to the needs of our students with disabilities.

# **Support for Mandated Programs**

# Transportation: Restore funding to FY10 level or exempt Transportation from the Tax Cap

- Combined expenditures for mandated transportation programs in our four sample districts exceed \$14,261,000 while State reimbursements amount to \$7,310,000
- Our school districts are required to fund the resulting gap of approximately \$6,951,000
- Reductions in the State Transportation formula require districts to use other operating dollars to provide mandated student transportation services
- In FY 11 state funding has been reduced by an additional 26% increasing the gap by an additional \$1,900,000



Increase Special Education Funding: Support IASB position 2.04 which encourages the State to totally fund with new monies, in a timely manner, the extra costs of educating children with special needs, including transportation and accessibility costs

# **Local Control: Support IASB Position 2.33 on Property Tax Caps**

### Support legislation that will...

### •Tax Cap Restrictions

• Exempt Property Tax Extension Limitation Law (PTELL) districts from the restrictions of the tax cap in their Fire and Life Safety, IMRF, Social Security and Tort Immunity funds.

### •ECI – Tax Cap

• Base the tax cap on the Employment Cost Index (ECI) which is more reflective of educational costs rather than use the Consumer Price Index (CPI).

### Tax Cap Floor

• Establish a floor to PTELL, set a minimum as well as maximum level of funding.



- Support IASB Resolution #6 requiring the Illinois General Assembly to determine the amount of funding for educational entitlements and General State Aid no later than March 31
- Provide additional flexibility with staffing decisions and the timing of implementing same. Current legislation does not allow districts to reduce program or personnel costs in proportion to state revenue reductions *after* March 31

# **Provide Budget Stability for Districts**

• Develop legislation allowing all districts to utilize debt service extension rates at a minimum percent of the allowable amount, not based on the debt districts had in 1991 when the debt service extension base was established. By statute, some districts cannot access this extension. Local community members would still have the ability to determine the appropriateness of the bonds.
